Tauranga & Whakatane Hospital:

The course runs for one year with one or two clinical placements

An intensive orientation occurs at commencement followed by ongoing education

A trained preceptor will be assigned to support you clinically, while a key training staff member will act in a coaching capacity

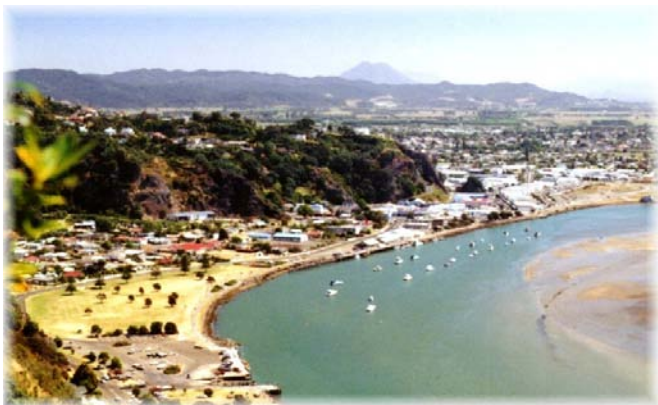


Graduate Nurse Programme January 2010

Eligibility

If you...

- ⇒ have NCNZ registration
- ⇒ have a current annual practicing certificate
- ⇒ are able to work 32 hours/week
- ⇒ have not practiced as a nurse for more than six months
- ⇒ are able to complete the programme in 12 months
